## Pastor's Page

### "Hesitant Leaders"

I recently was reading about when Saul was chosen to be king by the prophet Samuel. Saul's first response was, "But I am only from the tribe of Benjamin, the smallest tribe in Israel and my family is the least important of all the families of that tribe. Why are you talking that way to me?" (1 Samuel 9:21)

That sounded so familiar. I looked back at the call of Gideon. After Gideon is told by the Lord to "Go with the strength you have and rescue Israel from the Midianites" Gideon's response is, "But Lord, how can I rescue Israel? My clan is the weakest in the whole tribe of Manasseh and I am the least in my entire family!" (Judges 6: 14-15)

What's going on? Why does God choose people to do His will that appear to have so little self-confidence? Why does God choose people to do important tasks who feel they are ill-equipped and ill prepared to do the job?

Could it be that feelings of weakness and inadequacy are exactly the kind of feelings God wants in His chosen heroes? Could it be that God does not choose the self-confident, nor the gifted? Could it be that God chooses the weak and vulnerable?

Why?

God chooses the weak and vulnerable to do His work because God wants the power of deliverance and goodness to come from those intimately connected to Him and the power of the Holy Spirit.

When the disciples came into contact with the risen Lord Jesus told them to wait until they received the power of the Holy Spirit before they went out to share the good news. God wants those who are powered by the Spirit to do the work of God and not those powered by their own talents or abilities.

The Apostle Paul reports in 2 Corinthians 12:9 that Jesus said to him, "My kindness is all you need. My power is strongest when you are weak." So Paul concludes, "I will gladly brag at how weak I am."

Our missionaries to El Salvador are Jane and Betty Reaney, Terri and Sarah Flores. We are sending two mother-daughter teams to do mission work in El Salvador. Sounds frightening to me but these young women and their mothers are people not with exceptional gifts and talents, but with exceptional faith. They are gifted and talented but what makes them instruments of God's work in El Salvador is faith in Jesus who will supply their needs and make them instruments in the hand of God.

How exciting to send them off and I know without any doubt that God will accomplish great things through their witness.

Please support them in that witness! They need to raise \$4,000. They are doing a rummage sale June 11th and they are serving the Father's Day brunch June 19th. Give to their mission and the power of Christ will also be shared with you.

At the end of camp, all campers and staff will participate in a performance on July 28th at 6:30 p.m.

Summer camp is a great opportunity for children to learn God's word, socialize with others, sing praise songs, participate in art and music activities, explore self awareness, learn personal responsibility, play games with their peers (kickball was a favorite last year), and have fun! Campers do not need a music or art background to participate. Individual music lessons available (drums, flute, guitar, harmonica, piano, and voice). This year our theme is Safari – Go Wild for GOD! We will have some new rotations around this theme including a photography and sewing rotation. Staff interviews were March 15th. We have an amazing group of high school and college youth that will lead the rotations and be counselors.

Camper Applications are posted on the church website and will be due prior to the beginning of camp. The fee is the same as it has been for six years (no increase) - \$100 per camper, \$50 for each sibling per week. If you come the entire time the rate is only \$300 and \$100 for siblings. Scholarships are available.
