## Pastor's Page

Exodus 34:6 & 7

The Lord passed in front of Moses calling out, "Yahweh! The Lord, the God of compassion and mercy! I am slow to anger and filled with unfailing love and faithfulness. I lavish unfailing love to a thousand generations. I forgive iniquity, rebellion and sin. But I do not excuse the guilty. I lay the sins of the parents upon the children: the entire family is affected—even children in the third and fourth generations."

What a responsibility!

We often know that our actions have consequences, but we fail to see that those consequences are laying the foundation of faith for generation after generation.

We MUST do the work God has called us to do. We can't afford to be selfish. We can't afford to fail. We are asked to be a witness to faith in the community we find ourselves. But that witness must carry over into a people yet unknown. This is a witness that will lay the foundation of faith for countless generations to come.

I will be 59 years old this month. I am starting to plan my retirement. I am looking forward to sitting back so that others may step forward. But I am also aware that my most productive years at Carlton Hills may be ahead of me. I have been your pastor for six and a half years. In many ways I look around and I see that a foundation has been laid. This is a foundation that took all this time to establish. But where do we go from here?

I have no idea!!

I have no plans for our future. I only know that a foundation has been laid and God will give us that future and explain that future when we need to hear it.

I am so satisfied that we are on the right path. I am so thrilled at the most recent developments at our church.

I love the faithful response our church makes every Sunday to our "Offering for the Poor". This offering is a weekly reminder that we think first of the needs of others and we are faithful in giving to those needs. Our job is not to take care of ourselves. Our job is to take care of others and God will take care of us.

I am thrilled with the "One Salvation" youth led worship service. This is a worship service for our

youth, by our youth and reaching out to our youth. We live in a new age. The resources of this new age are largely secular in their orientation. We need to sanctify these resources for the work of the Kingdom of God and who better to use these tools of our culture than our youth who know these tools best. How amazingly blessed this portion of our ministry is by Belinda and Stephanie who share in this vision for mobilizing our youth for God's kingdom.

We can only look forward to the generations to come as we give thanks for the generations who have gone before us. I am looking forward to the "Celebrating the Saints" wall and a new pictorial directory to visualize our past and our present, so we can step forward into the future on the foundation of thankfulness. Many of our seniors are aging and I imagine many will not be with us by the time of my retirement. But I can promise that we will celebrate each and every one of them, caring for their sunset years with dignity and respect and giving praise to God that it is their witness that has made our witness possible.

Please consider your participation in the mission and ministry of our church. We recently completed our volunteer fair. But our church's need for volunteers is only matched by your spiritual need to volunteer and fulfill your calling.

I recently heard of someone who is frustrated in not having a job after looking for so long. We can all share how devastating that situation could be. But the worse thing we could do is fail to invest our lives in others when we are anxious in not meeting our own needs. I believe that God has a purpose in all of our life circumstances. I am also aware of others who have taken the very limited time they have to volunteer and be a blessing to others. The question we all need to answer is, "Given my circumstances what is God calling me to do to fulfill my call to discipleship in the Kingdom of Heaven?" Countless generations are dependent upon how we answer that question.

## Council Meeting Notes February 6th, 2011

Pastor Rick opened the meeting with a devotion from the book of Exodus. The reading covered first fruits and the law versus the spirit of the law.

Zach Zeller was introduced. Zach is the president of the youth, and a seat on the council for a youth representative is being considered by the council.

Jeff Sallay presented the audit for 2009. The overall conclusion is that the books and records of CHLC appear to be materially accurate. Comments and recommendations were provided, and are available upon request.

Penny Sallay presented multiple proposals for the new church directory. Keri Hyles also provided a proposal. The council will review all proposals and make a decision.

Keri Hyles discussed the Volunteer Fair, which will be held February 27th. This will provide the congregation, especially the new members, an opportunity to see first-hand the ministries CHLC supports, and how they can best share their gifts.

January reports that were available were presented and approved. Late reports will be added to the Secretaries binder and will be available upon request.

The meeting was adjourned with a motion by Mike Weber and a second by Laura Vaughan at 2:00.

- Additional fellowship hall on the other side of the sanctuary – Youth Center, split meetings.

- Columbian at the peak of the church
- Determine a focus group
- Congregational Meeting
- Level the concrete throughout the property
- **Drainage to prevent the sanctuary from flooding**
- New flooring in Sanctuary
- Roadway to front of Sanctuary
- Replace steps next to the trailer (leading to Activity Center)
