Pastor's Page

“Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth. Worship the Lord with gladness; come into his presence with singing... Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise.”
Psalm 100: 1, 2, and 4b

We have much to be thankful for this fall. Our second worship service will begin Sunday, October 1st from 5:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. in the Acts Center or on the patio where we will praise our Lord with joyful songs and thanksgiving.

The afternoon service will differ from our morning service in style; however, the content will be similar. We will begin with songs of praise and conclude with “liturgically sensitive” songs of confession, absolution, offertory, and communion, to name a few. The primary difference in the services is that the afternoon service will have a more contemporary sound and feature an electric and a rhythm guitar as well as drums. It is more in keeping with our sensitivities to have a louder worship service on Sunday afternoons and a quieter one in the morning. “Redemption,” an instrumental group from St. Andrews Lutheran in La Mesa, will provide musical backup for our high school singers from CHROS (Carlton Hills Redeemed Outreach Singers). How fitting is that?

The second service will not have a worship bulletin. Lyrics to the songs we sing will appear on screens for the convenience of the worshippers. When we are not singing, the screens will reflect images of worship such as symbols or scenes from everyday life and creation.

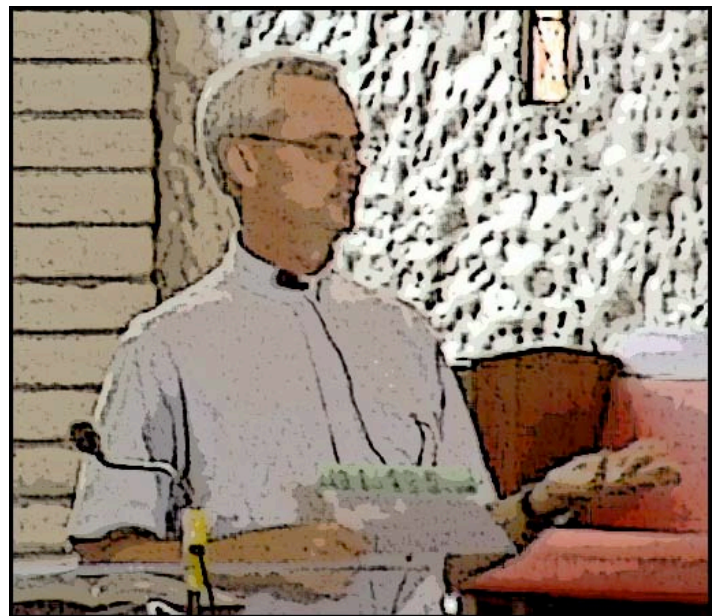
I will preach from the same lesson in both services. What will make the second “sermon” different is that I plan to have a dialogue with the worshipers—an opportunity for them to reflect and comment on the lesson.

Communion will always be served at the afternoon service but it will be served in a more relaxed and informal manner. We may give each other communion or we might file by a station where we will receive the bread and wine.

I would like to dispel any misconceptions some may have about our second service. Clapping to the beat of the songs may occur, but that will usually be the exception and not the rule. Also, even though this worship will often be loud, there will also be times of quiet reflection and meditation.

A late afternoon service provides a convenient alternative to worshippers who work on Sunday mornings and are unable to attend church. Those who were out late on Saturday night can sleep in Sunday morning and still attend a worship service. Folks who have been out of town for the weekend can participate in the afternoon service upon their return.

Come experience our second worship service. Some will find it very meaningful and others will not. There will be those, like me, who will enjoy both types of worship. A second service is important because it can serve as a powerful outreach to our community. It has the potential to reach those outside our doors with a contemporary sound that many find popular and exciting. Let us support one another, regardless of our tastes in music, as we fulfill our mission to be a witness of Christ's love for the world.


