Pastor's Page

Ezra 3:10,11-13

“When the builders completed the foundation of the Lord’s temple...many of the older priests, Levites and other leaders who had seen the first Temple wept aloud when they saw the new Temple’s foundation. The others however were shouting for joy. The joyful shouting and the weeping mingled together in a loud noise that could be heard far in the distance.”

Isn’t that a fascinating picture being painted?

“Joyful shouting” and “weeping” are described as “mingled together in a loud noise”. It is even a more fascinating picture when you realize it is the older generation doing the weeping and the younger generation doing the joyful shouting. And it is all happening because the temple’s foundation was now laid.

The book of Ezra is about the rebuilding of the temple. After the people of God had been conquered by the Assyrians they were sent into exile and the temple in Jerusalem had been destroyed. But in the years to follow the Persian king Cyrus conquered the Assyrians and the people of God were allowed to return to Jerusalem and rebuild the temple under Ezra’s leadership. The above verses describe the reaction of God’s people to the laying of the foundation of the new temple. The older generation was in mourning and the younger generation rejoiced.

Why?

It may be true that the older generation was weeping for joy but certainly not entirely. The laying of the foundation for the new temple brought to mind the pain and suffering that they had experienced in having the first temple destroyed and the exile and enslavement that followed.

The younger generation was rejoicing because their focus was on the future and the rebuilding of the temple that was once destroyed but would now become glorious again. It is true that the new temple may never be as rich and plush as the one destroyed, but they had no memories of the old temple and what was going to replace it.

It is so true that there are generation differences. The older generation tends to look at life from the perspective of the past. The younger generation looks

at life from the perspective of the potential for the future and its hidden promises.

Don’t we need both perspectives? Isn’t it important to remember the past? We really need to remember the mistakes of the past. It has been said that unless we remember the mistakes of the past we are doomed to repeat those mistakes. We just celebrated Dusty and Florence Hustad’s 60th wedding anniversary. That witness to marital faithfulness is inspiring to us all.

But we also need to look to our future with new eyes and a new perspective. It has also been said that a definition of insanity is doing the same thing over and over and expecting different results.

One of the things that I like most about Carlton Hills is that we have an intergenerational environment at our church. We have a lot of people who represent all the generations and we can be richer for that diversity. I say we “can” be richer because the differences between our generational perspectives can also be a source of conflict and division. The key is that we must listen to one another and value the opinions of the generations that are different from our own.

We are going in both directions at full speed.

Our senior ministries are vibrant and growing. The senior lunch started with 15-20 participants and now the meal is served to 30-40 participants. The “Celebrating the Saints” wall is now a reality as it lifts up the saints from our church that have made our church what it is today.

Our youth started “One Salvation” a Tuesday evening youth led worship service and now there are youth from the community that are seeking baptism, confirmation and membership in our church. Our Joyful Noise Camp had its largest participation with 44 campers and 15 youth staff. I believe the quality of this year’s camp is a direct reflection of the leadership that has been developed by One Salvation.

What does the future for our church hold? I can say with confidence I have no idea; but it will be exciting and it will be a glorious mix of the new and the old. We will honor the past and we will experiment in the future. What we all need to remember is to be faithful to our Lord and to listen to the wisdom of those around us.

Help for Struggling Students

Due to the state's budget crisis, teachers are going to be taxed even more. Those teachers that will be allowed to keep their positions are going to be even more overwhelmed by the increased number of students they will have to teach in the 2011-12 school year. There will be more combo classes, two grades in one classroom, than ever before in schools. These combo classes are the equivalent of teaching two classes at the same time. Additionally, many school districts are being forced to cut many special day classes causing mild/moderate special education students to be placed into main stream general education classrooms. This also increases the stress and spreads the general education teacher even thinner. Then, all those added desks make it nearly impossible for teachers to even look over the shoulder of their students to check their work. Finally, the school districts and state pacing schedules force teachers to blow through material at such a fast pace, so students are exposed to all the concepts on the tests, that many students do not master the concepts.

These factors are all out of the teachers' control, so it's no wonder many students are struggling. Teachers are doing their best, but they just are not super human.
